Water supply restored

WATER supply to KwaDukuza residents returned to normal on Wednesday, September 23 (today) after a week of uncertainty with the service.

Problems with the supply began on Wednesday afternoon, September 16, after a major electrical board at the Umvoti Water Works burnt out.

It needed to be replaced and senior

officials from Umgeni Water were contacted to resolve the problem.

iLembe District municipal manager, Mike Newton, said when they received the news, they immediately contacted Umgeni Water so that they could begin working on the problem.

"There was no stock of the electrical board but Umgeni Water managed to get one and the board was replaced by 5:30am the next day. However, the

levels in the reservoirs dropped in this time because no water was filling into them."

Ten tankers were sent into the areas to provide residents with water until the water supply returned to normal.

"We want to apologise to the residents for any inconvenience caused and we assure them that it has been sorted out." said Newton.
